he seems like a nice guy.

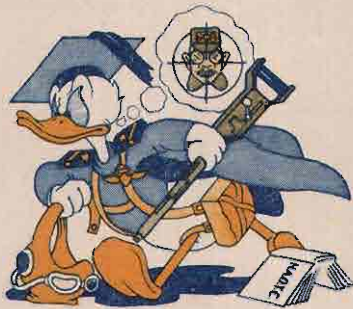
Send me some tennis shoes if you can.

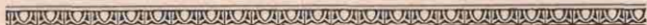
