

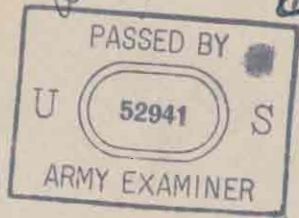

June 30, 1945

Dear Folks,

I received two letters from dad today dated June 15 + 17 and I was so sorry to learn that you had been so worried about me. I hope that you ~~won't~~ won't be so worried, and if my letters don't get to you so quick I want you to know that I'll still be alright and that I am well and have never felt better in my life. I am working outside and eating fairly good and getting plenty of exercise. You say that you didn't get but 3 letters from me in a 2 week period. I thought I had written more than that but maybe I didn't. I shall try to do better on my correspondence in the future, however.

I have gotten two letters from P. Anales and one from Grandma Bass + Aunt Maude, but I never heard from Bud.

I got your air mail stamps and I can use them. I also would like to have about \$10 in money. I haven't been paid since I left the States and I am ~~now~~ now beginning to need money for soap, cigarettes, pipe tobacco

candy, stationary etc. up until a few days ago all that was given to us but now we have to buy it ourselves. When you send it just send a \$10 bill as I can't cash a check or a money order.

We have "jooks" laundries over here and they do pretty good, but like every other laundry you are likely to get your own clothes back. They also have outdoor movies here but I haven't been able to see one yet. I am going to try to send in my application when they get things straightened out here and I will let you know when I do.
