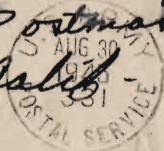

Dear folks,
I got another package from you
yesterday with some magazines,
which I really was glad to get
and two delicious peaches
rolls. The package was
in excellent shape so were the
other three I have goldclipped.

This afternoon I went to
a shop with 15 ay 5 yser
as the master of ceremonies. I
had an Army band and club
Kibbel sang for beautiful
girls with hair, one was from
Houston, Texas. It was a
pretty fair show and we
enjoyed it most because
of being able to see American
girls and because he made
a lot of cracks about
officers.

Things are pretty much the
same around here and nothing
happens. We have a pretty
nice camp with food and fights
in the tent, pretty fair show
and a movie nearly every night.

I have some also built a
gymnasium but used as a recreation
hall. I have one table to write

letters and a Victrola, Radio + library
and piano, I don't like.

I am in it now writing this letter.

Things are getting mighty
booming over here and it
looks like they are going
to try to keep us
from a long time. I
guess you people will
have to get on the
ball and get after

Congress to get us
home. We are not doing
a thing here and it seems
a shame just to be sitting
around doing nothing. I've
got about 20 times as many
military Govt. personnel here
as they need.
