of letter writing. The weather here  
is about the same as it is back  
home, this time of the year.

I have just finished listening  
to the third game of the world  
series rebroadcast. The broadcast  
comes on at 3:30 in the morning  
over here so nearly everybody  
listens to the rebroadcast.

I received the letter from  
Mr. Maen and took my camera  
and went hunting for the cemetery  
but, I didn't find it. He was  
buried at 46 Dew Cemetery Temporary  
Cemetery No. 2. I found No. 1. but  
couldn't find no. 3. There are 17  
Cemeteries on the island so I may  
never have had time finding it, however  
I'm going to look again. When looking  
for it before I ran across the International  
Cemetery where Admiral Perrin men  
were buried.

I can't think of anything else to write.
