October 10, 1945

Dear Folks,

I have just gone through a most
distasteful experience. We have just
had a typhoon here which blew
the island nearly all way. All of our
tents were blown off and some metal
was blown off the ground huts,
which the officers are in. Everything
I had was soaked and I had to
spend the night in wet clothes and
feet. I have just managed to
secure some new ones. The tents that
could be salvaged have been put
up again and some of the fellows
have moved back in. I'm staying
temporarily in the Communications
office where I am working now.
I operate the telephone
switchboard here. I like the
job well and may be able
to get a Pat here.

The storm did fruit a bit of
damage here including sinking
several ships. Over 200 ships of
all types were damaged. Several
planes were washed too.

My film was all ruined so
I don't know if I can get the
picture for Mr. & Mrs. Healey,
but I wish you would tell them
that I will do my best
