DEAR FOLKS ,

ITS SATURDAY AFTERNOON AND I AM SITTING HERE IN THE OFFICE WRITING YOU THIS LETTER. SEVERAL OF THE FELLOWS WHO HAVE RETURNED FROM SHANGHAI HAVE BROUGHT BACK NICE SILK PAJAMAS AND OTHER NICE STUFF. FROM ALL REPORTS ITS QUITE A WILD CITY. THERE HAVE BEEN TALES OF MEN SELLING BLACKJACKS ON THE STREETS . HTYE SEND ABOUT 10 MEN A WEEK FROM HERE OVER ON LIBE RTY PARTIES . THEY SPREND FROM A WEEK TO TEN DAYS OVER THERE . I SHOULD BE ABLE TO GO SOMETIME WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH.

I HAVENT HAD ANY MAIL FROM YOU FOR A FEW DAYS NAD I STILL DONT KNOW WHETHER YOU HAVE RECEIVED MY CHECK FOR 550 BUT I GUESS I HAVENT HAD TIME TO HAVE HEARD YET.

LIFE AS USUAL IS VERY DULL AROUND HERE AND THE TIME PASSES VERY SLOWLY. WE HAVE NOTHING TO DO BUT SIT AROUD AND THINK ABOUT GOING HOME. I HAVE GOTTEN TO THE POINT WHERE I DONT WANT TO GO HOME UNTIL ITS TIME FOR ME TO BE DISCHARGED BUT I SURE WOULD LIKE TO GET TO SOME OTHERE PLACE BESIDES OKINAWA. A TRIP TO SHANHAI WOULD MAKE THE TIME PASS A LITTLE FASTER BUT EVEN THAT WONT LAST LONG AD IT LOOKS LIKE I AM STUCK WITH THIS PLACE UNTIL TIME FOR DIS CHARGE.
