Dear Folks,
Anot her Sunday and I am back writing a letter to you . I have just returned from church and am enclosing a program in which you might be interested.

We had an typhoon warning yesterday but it turned out to be only a slight breeze which is continuing today. We will probably have several of them from now on until the time that I will go home I only hope that they dont interfere with the shipping which is already in a none too good a shape . Our fellos who went to NOB on 23 March are still waiting for a ship. I certainly hope that I dont have to wait that long for one . It looks to men like that if they can carry all those British war brides back that they could at least provide shipping facilities that will get us home in time for the discharge date set up by the navy dept.

They might try to hold us 90 days after our date for discharge "because of military necessity " but I dont think that they will do that. I do know that if they try it they will have a strike that has never been equalled on their hands . As I said before I dont think that they will try anything like that .

The only mail that I got from you this week was two Easter cards I hope that I hear from you next week. I am anxious to hear how the situation on school is getting along. I hope that you will be able to find me a place to stay. May be if you cant get a anything is. Austin will be able to get a car and drive to school from Georgetown or some other town near by.

I hope that the clothing situation back home has been relieved somewhat .

Boy will I be glad when I can put on some decent clothes and go to church back home on a Sunday morning. I am surely going mad when I get home and dont have to live like a dog any more. It seems like I have been living in a dream for the past year. It doesnt seem like all this could have happened. Sometimes it seems like a long time and then at other times it seems like it has never happened at all and that time has been standing still.

I guess the war has at least woken us up and I dont think that we are likely to go to sleep for a long time now, and if we do goddy US. People back home cant realize how much better off we are than the rest of the world. Its sometimes hard to understand just why we are so much better off than all the rest of the world. WE have never given them much thought ~~than~~ before the war, but It looks like we are really going ^{EE} to world minded from now on.

Well enough of this big talk from a teenager.
